

Scholarship Application Form and Instructions for Family Member

The Central Florida Marine Corps Foundation (CFMCF), as an active and supportive member of the local community, provides scholarships to deserving undergraduate students based on evaluation of academic merit, community service and involvement and embodiment of Marine Corps core values.

Five scholarships will be awarded in the amounts of \$2500, \$2250, \$2000, \$1750 and \$1500 to the applicants the Scholarship Selection Committee determines to have the best combination of academic performance, service and involvement in the community, and embodiment of the core values of Honor, Courage, and Commitment. The committee will notify all scholarship applicants in writing once the selection process is completed.

The Foundation's scholarships are available to students who are residents in any of Central Florida's seven Counties: Brevard, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Polk, Seminole, and Volusia, and who are registered/accepted into an accredited Junior College, four-year college, or university.

Note: If proof of College/University acceptance is not available at the time of submission for this application, an acceptance letter may be submitted at a later date. Please note that scholarship awards will not be presented until college acceptance is verified.

Additional student/applicant eligibility criteria are listed below.

Eligibility Requirements:

- A. Applicants must meet **one** of the following three criteria:
 1. The son/daughter/grandchild/spouse of an active duty or reserve US Marine or of a US Marine who received an Honorable or Medical Discharge or who died while serving in the US Marine Corps.
 - a. Provide Unit Name and Address for a Marine presently on active duty or provide a copy of the former Marine's DD214 including the characterization of service and the reenlistment code.
 2. A student enrolled in a Marine Corps Junior ROTC program or Marine option Senior ROTC Midshipman.
 3. The son/daughter/grandchild/spouse of an active duty, reserve, honorably discharged, or medically discharged US Navy Corpsman who serves, or has served at least 6 months, with the US Marine Corps.
 - a. Provide with your application the name of the Marine unit and dates of service with that unit of the Corpsman.
 - b. Provide the DD214 with the Honorable characterization of service and the reenlistment code
- B. Applicant must provide proof that he/she currently resides in one of the following seven Central Florida Counties: Brevard, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Polk, Seminole, or Volusia.
- C. Applicant must be in the process of applying to or attending as an undergraduate student at an accredited junior college, four-year college, or university.

Note: Proof of acceptance and/or enrollment, e.g. a schedule of enrolled classes from the college, will be required prior to actual award of scholarship funds.

All applications must be post marked by **January 31, 2025**. Late, unsigned, or incomplete submissions will not be accepted or considered. **YOU WILL NOT BE NOTIFIED IF YOUR APPLICATION IS INCOMPLETE**

Additional student/applicant eligibility criteria are listed below. Contact CFMCFScholarships@gmail.com prior to mailing your application package if you have any questions about the intent or need clarification on the instructions below.

A complete application must include:

1. The completed application form **with signed enclosure checklist**,
2. A 300- to 500-word, typed (Times New Roman 12 point, 8½ X 11 paper, double-spaced)
 - The Essay should address the following subjects:
 - Your involvement in extracurricular and/or community activities (i.e., civic organizations, school, or church, etc.) and should detail how you made a positive contribution to your community.
 - Information about your career goals and future plans.
 - What the Marine Corps' Core Values of Honor, Courage and Commitment mean to you at this point in your life and how the example of the Marine in your life influenced you. **THIS IS IMPORTANT**
 - Your love and pride in being an American citizen and your patriotic values
 - AND
 - Each Essay should state why you are applying for this scholarship.
 - Place your full name at the top of the first page of your essay.
3. **Transcripts with Grade Point Average:** Provide all high school and college transcripts indicating courses taken and grades earned. High school seniors and college freshmen are required to submit high school transcripts and any available college transcripts. Current college students with at least 60 credit hours are only required to submit college transcripts. Document an unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.0. High school seniors are encouraged to include an acceptance letter from a college or university.
4. **Standardized Test Scores:** document your scores on ACT, SAT, FCAT, etc. (Note: Standardized Test Scores are only required for high school seniors and current college freshmen applicants.)
5. **Letters of Recommendation:** Two recommendation letters are required. One from each category below:
 - Provide one letter of recommendation from a mentor, community leader, or businessperson.
 - Provide one letter of recommendation from a school official, i.e., teacher, professor, or guidance counselor. (For this category, **Marine Corps Junior ROTC students** must provide a letter of recommendation from the Marine Corps JROTC instructor in your high school).

Notification: All applicants will be notified by email at the email address on the application form of the CFMCF's decision as to whether they have been selected to receive a scholarship or not. Notification is typically during the month of March. Recipients will be required to complete and sign an acceptance form with instructions for attending the scholarship presentation reception in Orlando in mid-April, 2025. The amount of the scholarship awards will be announced at the scholarship presentation reception. Payment of the scholarships will be made via check made to the recipient upon confirmation of enrollment for the summer or fall semester.
