Iwo Jima Partner



U.S. Marines hit the black sand beaches of Iwo Jima, beginning one of the most famous battles in the history of the Marine Corps. From Feb. 19 to March 26, 1945, U.S. Marines from the 3rd, 4th and 5th Marine Divisions battled to wrest control of the island from the Imperial Army of Japan. The iconic flag raising on Mount Suribachi on February 23, 1945, didn't end the fight, but it became a lasting symbol of American resolve and inspired Marines across the island.

The Battle of Belleau Wood was where Marines proved who we are. There we earned the name Teufel Hunden, Devil Dogs, through blood, grit, and relentless determination. On June 6, 1918, the 4th Marine Brigade charged into the woods near Belleau, crushing the German 237th Division and cementing the Marine Corps' reputation as an unstoppable fighting force.

Hue City Partner

On Jan. 30, 1968, Hue became the site of one of the longest, bloodiest battles the Americans would fight against the North Vietnamese Army, or NVA, and its Viet Cong guerrillas living in South Vietnam. As part of a much larger and costly offensive, it became a turning point as public opinion in the United States began to turn against the war. For an entire month, U.S. Marines and soldiers, along with ARVN troops, waged battles throughout the city, often going house to house to remove Hue from North Vietnamese control. It was the first time Marines had engaged in urban combat since the Korean War. The Battle of Hue reshaped Marine Corps warfare, proving the grit and adaptability of Marines in brutal urban combat.

Fallujah Partner

Few names conjure up as many images of blood, sacrifice, and valor as does this ancient city in Al Anbar province forty miles west of Baghdad. This sprawling concrete jungle was the scene of two major U.S. combat operations in 2004. The first was Operation Vigilant Resolve, an aborted effort that April by U.S. Marines intent on punishing the city's insurgents. The second, Operation Phantom Fury, was launched seven months later.

Chosin Partner

The Battle of the Chosin Reservoir stands as one of the most defining moments in Marine Corps history. In late November 1950, Marines found themselves surrounded as Chinese forces entered the war, fighting for 17 brutal days in temperatures so cold thermometers broke. Despite overwhelming odds and extreme conditions, their courage and determination led to 13 Medals of Honor and earned them the lasting title of the Chosin Few. Outnumbered, outgunned, and frozen, Marines fought their way out while maintaining unit cohesion and never leaving their wounded behind. Their actions at Chosin became a timeless example of Marine grit, leadership, and unbreakable brotherhood.
